Artist Statement

My worldview was formed in the San Francisco Bay Area during the 1950s and sixties, when the language and symbols of existing power structures (politics, religion, gender identity, economics and marketing) were being questioned and destabilized. I grew up in a bilingual family with parents who spoke Spanish/and English, which meant a lot of word play, double entendres and humor. My multilingual father was involved in cryptography during the Cold War, which added another layer of disruption and subterfuge to my interpretation skills. I was nurtured to subvert meaning. We have always lived in an environment of hidden agendas, misleading and false information. The Internet and digital media have sped up the dissemination of misinformation, but it has not altered human nature.

History plays a central role in my work. As I have gotten older, I'm more able to understand that the culture and zeitgeist of a period are shaped by larger forces. I can see my own life trajectory within the span of history. My work consists of choosing cultural and technological artifacts, icons and power objects from disparate places and periods and re-creating "fusion" artifacts from them. My sculptures reframe and compress history in an effort to reveal underlying human motivations and biological imperatives. I often employ cultural signifiers or words that are in emotional or ideological conflict with each other. The collision of ideas I present is usually humorous and unsettling at the same time.

I moved to Lamy, New Mexico in 2014. Since moving here I have focused my attention more on local issues of land use and exploited resources, and the effects of colonialism and Manifest Destiny. The influence of land and regional history has led me to hand-fabricating components from local materials like turned wood, sewn leather and stone, along with found and repurposed artifacts.

Walter Robinson Biography

Working in a range of media—wood, epoxy, metal, leather, and found materials—Walter Robinson hand-fabricates and assembles objects, signage and tableaux. Through his work, Robinson investigates the mechanics of cultural and social anthropology. Using text and the strategies of appropriation, conflation, and dislocation, he uncovers the subconscious and biological human imperatives hidden beneath social, political, religious, and capitalist packaging.

Robinson's work has been featured in solo exhibitions at the San Jose Museum of Art, CA and the Montalvo Arts Center in Saratoga, CA, and in numerous group exhibitions across the United States and abroad. His work is in the collections of the Museum of Contemporary Art San Diego, CA; the Crocker Art Museum, Sacramento, CA; the Nevada Museum of Art in Reno; the San Jose Museum of Art, CA; the di Rosa Center for Contemporary Art, Napa, CA; the Sheldon Museum of Art, Lincoln, NE; and the Djerassi Foundation, Woodside, CA. Recently, Walter's works have been exhibited at the New Mexico Museum of Art and the Center for Contemporary Art in Santa Fe. His work has received critical attention from a number of print and online publications, including Artforum, ArtReview, Vanity Fair, Juxtapoz, the San Francisco Chronicle, THE Magazine and artpractical.com. An alumnus of the M.F.A. program at Lone Mountain College in San Francisco, CA, he also studied at the San Francisco Art Institute and the California College of the Arts. In 2014, Robinson moved from San Francisco to Lamy, New Mexico. His artwork is represented by Turner Carroll Gallery in Santa Fe, NM, Robischon Gallery in Denver COand by Zidoun-Bossuyt Gallery in Luxembourg.
